REGULATIONS FOR PHOTOGRAPHY / FILMING / SOUND RECORDING IN AND ON THE PREMISES OF THE JEWISH MUSEUM BERLIN

1. Please be considerate of the guided tours and visitors. Make sure that visitors, delivery services and the administration are not unnecessarily interrupted by your work.
2. The conception and construction of the Jewish Museum Berlin is protected on copyright by its architect, Daniel Libeskind (as represented by Studio Daniel Libeskind, 2 Rector Street, New York, NY 10006, USA).
3. The production of photographs, graphic images, or other images of the outside and inside structure of the Jewish Museum Berlin is permitted only for personal, school and studies use and for press coverage of the Jewish Museum Berlin. Other uses of depictions require previous written permission and may incur a fee. The use of images of the museum for commercial purposes or passing the material to a third party is strictly prohibited.
4. If you intend to take close-ups of particular exhibition objects, we kindly ask you to contact us (Tel.: +49 30 25993-456). Many of the shown objects are loans. The JMB is obligated to adhere the copyright agreements made with donors and lenders.
5. The objects shown in the museum are sensitive to light. For this reason, photographers should use digital cameras or mechanical cameras without additional lighting. For the protection of the objects in our exhibition, the use of flash is not permitted.
6. If extra lighting is required for filming purposes, we ask you to observe the following rules:
 - Be particularly careful with paper and textiles because of their fragility and sensitivity to light.
 - For objects in cases, please resort to cold light sources only, so that the air temperature inside the case is not altered.
 - Illumination may occur for up to one minute. Lights must be turned off when adjusting and preparing the camera.
 - Keep a minimum distance of 1.5 meters from the object.
7. Please do not pull heavy cases (or any other heavy equipment) across the floors, and please pay particular attention when moving large or bulky objects, such as tripods. The use of tripods for photographing must be approved by the Press and Public Relations Department. Please contact us by phone.
8. The liability of the Jewish Museum Berlin is limited to gross fault and negligence.
